

Lubambe builds clinic

TO ENHANCE access to quality primary health services by its employees and contractors, Lubambe Copper Mine (LCM) in Chililabombwe has built a US\$300,000 state-of-the-art dinic.

The mine's communication manager, Royce Saili, said in a statement that an ambulance has also been bought to provide quick emergency responses.

The clinic will provide 24-hour services for multiple emergencies, primary and occupational cases, wellness programmes and trauma cases.

The mine has also employed various staff who include a resident medical doctor, three nurses and four drivers.

LCM general manager operations Tony Davis said during the launch of the clinic that he is happy with the strides the mine has made in raising its standards in safety and health services to its employees.
