President Hichilema Relaunches Lubambe Copper Mine Limited



President Hichilema Relaunches Lubambe Copper Mine Limited

Lubambe Copper Mine Limited was a hive of activity on Friday, May 30, 2025, as President Hakainde Hichilema officially relaunched the Mine and announced JCHX Mining Limited as the major shareholder to the nation.

The event also was graced with a ground-breaking ceremony for the construction of two new shafts at 700 and 1,350 meter levels respectively, a strategic initiative aimed at enhancing copper production and contributing to Zambia's ambitious target of 3 million tonnes per year by 2031.

Speaking at the event, President Hichilema highlighted the tangible benefits emerging from Zambia's strengthened cooperation with China, citing various development projects.

The President stated that the partnership was yielding tangible benefits for the Zambian people, reflecting the country's renewed economic growth fuelled by responsible foreign investment.

President Hichilema highlighted the significance of the event, marking a crucial step in Zambia's journey to harness its mineral wealth, and underscored the need for investments that produce measurable results for the nation and its people.

The President reassured Lubambe's management and employees that both the Government and local communities would offer their support to ensure the success of the mine's operations.

He encouraged the Mine to continue working responsibly and safely, applying technology to access the ore body efficiently and make the mine commercially viable.

President Hichilema expressed appreciation for the resilience of Lubambe's employees, who have endured difficult times, and urged them to continue working together to achieve the mine's goals.

And JCHX Mining Limited Group Chairman, Mr. Wang Qinghai in his speech said the relaunch of Lubambe marked a significant milestone, not just for the mine, but for Zambia's mining industry as a whole.

Mr. Wang emphasized this point in his address, describing the ceremony as a testament to the resilience and partnership that defined the company's journey in Zambia.

"We are grateful for the unwavering support we have received from the Government, particularly the Ministry of Mines and Minerals Development, Zambia Environmental Management Agency (ZEMA) and other Government agencies. This support has been instrumental in making today's event a success," he said.

Lubambe Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Wu Shuanjun, expressed his gratitude to the Government for its crucial role in facilitating the

transition, which was managed effectively through engagement and consultation with a wide range of stakeholders.

"When JCHX acquired the Mine, Lubambe was facing significant challenges," Mr. Wu said. "To address these challenges, we invested in a number of initiatives, with the most notable being the construction of two new shafts." These shafts are critical to improving mining operations and supporting the overall economic viability of the mine.

Mr. Wu said the new shafts would enhance the growth and yield economic benefits to the nation, the district, employees, and families.

He said the significance of the two shafts lies in their ability to boost copper production, increase the life of the mine, improve operational efficiency, and reduce operational costs, making the mine more viable and beneficial to local communities.

He attributed the success of the project to the good policies under the Government's leadership, which had created a favourable environment for investment.

Mr. Wu further said Lubambe was committed to uplifting the welfare and livelihoods of the communities in which we live and work, in line with the vision of President Hichilema's administration," he said.

Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipoteniary of the People's Republic of China in Zambia, Mr Han Jing said China would continue to partner with Zambia to overcome the country's social and economic challenges.

Mr. Han said his country was looking forward to further tighten ties by signing Memorandum of Understanding on green minerals Cooperation to boost value addition.

And ZCCM-IH PLC Board Chairperson, Mr. Kakenenwa Muyangwa said the relaunch marked a significant turning point for Lubambe symbolizing renewed commitment and strategic direction under the partnership with JCHX.

The relaunch of Lubambe Copper Mine Limited under the new investor is expected to boost copper production and contribute to Zambia's economic growth.

Mines and Minerals Development Minister Hon. Paul Kabuswe on Friday. 4th April, 2025 visited Lubambe Copper Mine Limited on a factfinding mission on the mine's operations, compliance and employees' welfare.

Mr. Kabuswe was accompanied by Copperbelt Provincial Minister Hon. Elisha Matambo.

Permanent Secretary Mr. Lawrence Mwanza, Senior Government and United Party for National Development (UPND) officials.

During the visit, the two Ministers held a meeting with Lubambe Senior Management officials, suppliers and contractors, Lubambe employees and their respective unions.

During his interaction with Senior Management Officials led by Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Wu Shuanjun, Mr. Kabuswe was happy with the level of capital investment that JCHX had committed into Lubambe.

Mr. Kabuswe said the investment of \$300 million being pumped into the Mine was clear indication of the confidence the investor had in the Government's policies.

He assured Lubambe management that the Government would continue to render support to the Mine because it valued investment.

"I am very encouraged with the figures I'm hearing in terms of the investment that you are putting in because critical to us as the New Dawn Government is actually investment flowing into the economy and that investment must translate into productivity especially for the Mining sector and create more jobs for our people," he said.

Mr. Matambo was grateful to JCHX for not laying off employees after taking over the operations of Lubambe.

He urged management to consider increasing the number of direct Lubambe employees as opposed to having more of contractor employees.

"We stand ready as provincial administration to support this project so that the goals intended are achieved. I am excited to hear that at peak production, Lubambe will contribute 45,000 tonnes of copper annually towards the Government's target of 3 million tonnes by 2031," he said.

Briefing the two Ministers on investments and operations, Mr. Wu said since it took over operations of the Mine, JCHX had so far invested \$92 million in the technical improvement projects which included the acquisition of new equipment, enhacement of the dewatering system, ventilation improvement and explorations aimed at extending the life of mine and boosting copper production.

Mr. Wu stated that an additional \$200 million would be pumped in the sinking of two new shafts at 700 and 1,350 meter levels respectively.

JCHX Praised for Landmark Border Infrastructure Development

In a significant boost to regional trade and border management, JCHX Mining Management Company Limited has constructed a state-of-the-art border post at Lonshi Border Control in Masaiti District of the Copperbelt Province.

The \$1 million project, undertaken as part of the Company's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives, has been hailed by the Zambian Government describing it as a critical milestone in border management and governance.

The project which commenced in 2023 includes an office block, three housing units, public sanitation facilities, and parking lots.

JCHX Mining Management Company Limited representative Mr. Zhou Gen Ming said the mine remained committed to carrying out CSR programmes that benefit the community.

Speaking during the handover of the facility on Friday, 11th April, 2025, Mr. Zhou who is also Sabwe Mining Chief Executive Officer was confident that the newly constructed border facility would enhance Zambia's foreign economic and trade cooperation, resulting in significant benefits for the Zambian people.

He said that since JCHX started operating in Zambia in 2000, they had considered Zambia as their second home hence the commitment to ensuring that their activities not only support their business objectives but also contribute positively to the host country.

"Over the years, JCHX has consistently contributed to various sectors essential to people's livelihoods, including education, healthcare, and infrastructure development in Zambia. We have steadfastly honoured our commitment to "grow together with the local communities," striving to achieve a balance between resource development and ecological conservation," he said.

Home Affairs and Internal Security Minister, Hon. Jack Mwiimbu said the construction of a border facility at Lonshi by JCHX was a testament of the good relations that existed between the Zambian Government and JCHX Mining Company.

Mr. Mwiimbu commended JCHX for its exceptional work, noting that the modern infrastructure would improve service delivery and staff welfare.

He said JCHX's commitment to community development was evident in its significant investment in the Lonshi border control project.

He said it was not only about growing different crops but a holistic approach that embraced a variety of strategies to build resilience, enhance productivity, and safeguard the future in the face of a changing climate.

Witnessing from last farming season's erratic rainfall, it is true that rainfall has become so unpredictable and hence crop diversification is one of the most resilient practice to climate change farmers can use," he said.

Lubambe Hosts Infrastructure PS for Housing and Urban Development Discussions

On Friday, 27th June, 2025, Ministry of Infrastructure, Housing and Urban Development Permanent Secretary Professor Albert Malama in the company of Copperbelt Infrastructure Officer Mr. Haggai Kaoma visited Lubambe Copper Mine Limited with an aim of exploring ways to address housing needs for employees and establish urban centres around mining operations.

The Permanent Secretary, who had prior meetings with Mimbula Mine in Chingola and Mingomba Mine, was received by Lubambe's Deputy Chief Executive Officer Mr. Daniel Chihili, Chief Financial Officer, Mr. Eustus Munsaka, Director Risk, Compliance and Corporate Affairs Mr.Ali Simukonda and Human Resources Manager Mr. Future Muzungaire.

The meeting focused on understanding the housing requirements for mine employees and assessing the feasibility of creating urban centres and industrial zones in collaboration with the Zambia Development Agency (ZDA).

The discussions also highlighted the housing deficit in Chililabombwe District, exacerbated by increased mining activities.

The meeting underscored the collaborative efforts between Lubambe and Government to address critical infrastructure needs and promote sustainable development in the region.

Prof. Malama expressed Government's interest in reducing housing deficit in the district and promoting economic stimulation beyond mining.

He acknowledged the request and offered to share contact details of a developer engaged by Mimbula Mine to construct 500 houses, potentially facilitating a structured proposal for uniform housing standards.

"We are visiting the Mine to establish and understand the housing needs for employees and also to assess how Urban Centres and Industrial Zones could be established around the Mines working with ZDA.

"It is Government's desire that Urban Centres and Industrial Zones are created in proximity to mining operations so that they can feed into the value chain and stimulate the economy beyond mining. The Ministry of Infrastructure will be engaging the local Municipality to make land available for this initiative," Prof. Malama said during the meeting.

And Mr. Chihili informed the Permanent Secretary that 40 hectares of land had been allocated for employee housing, with subdivision plans underway to be followed by title deed application.

He sought support from the Permanent Secretary's office with expediting the titling process.

Lubambe Cuts Costs by \$1 Million Through Innovative Initiatives

Lubambe Copper Mine Limited has achieved significant cost savings, totalling \$1 million in the first quarter of 2025 through targeted cost-saving measures driven by its departments.

In an interview, LCML Finance Manager Mr. Charles Mbewe highlighted that the 'Cost Reduction and Efficiency Improvement' Campaign, launched in January this year, prompted departments to develop and implement various cost-saving strategies.

The savings breakdown shows Metallurgy saved \$346,275, Technical Services \$338,120, Finance \$203,574, Mining Engineering saved \$105,640, and Corporate Affairs saved \$8,096 through their respective initiatives.

He explained that the Metallurgy Department's savings came from initiatives like in-house repairs and mill ball recycling, whereas Mining Engineering focused on repairing equipment in-house. Technical Services achieved savings through contract renegotiation and substituting zinc sulphate with black split sets.

"Technical Services achieved savings through contract renegotiation and substituting zinc sulphate with black split sets. The Finance Department also saved through contract renegotiation. Meanwhile, Corporate Affairs' savings came from initiatives from Information Technology and Security," he said.

As the Finance Department enjoyed snacks and refreshments, having decided to share their award, Mr. Ma Pingping, LCML Assistant to the CEO, acknowledged their K500 gift voucher win, emphasizing that it was a team effort.

And LCML's Assistant Metallurgical Manager Mr. Alick Mhone said as a token of appreciation, 38 employees in the Department were awarded gift vouchers for their role in implementing cost-saving measures.

We need to support each-Other and appreciate each other's efforts for the development among the company, the local authority and host community," he said. LCML SHET Manager, Mr. Gideon Sinkamba and CSR Manager Mr. Nchimunya Nachilime highlighted Lubambe's operations and CSR programmes respectively, which the team highly appreciated.

The visit underscored the growing recognition of the critical role CSR plays in fostering positive relationships between mining firms and local communities.

Lubambe Copper Mine Limited's Safety, Health, Environment, and Training (SHET) Department has raised concerns over the increasing number of equipment damage incidents, citing 14 cases recorded since January this year.

SHET Manager, Mr. Gideon Sinkamba, addressed mobile equipment operators and light vehicle drivers during a Stand Down on Thursday May 22, 2025, emphasizing the critical role they play in ensuring safe copper production without harm.

"We have noted with concern the alarming rate of incidents involving equipment, both on the surface and underground, as well as heavy-duty and light-duty vehicles," Mr. Sinkamba said. "With 14 incidents recorded since January, this trend is not only worrying but also unsustainable."

Mr. Sinkamba stressed the need for collective action to identify the root causes of these incidents, which have occurred across both in day and night shifts.

"Why should we have incidents when we can prevent them? We are here to find solutions and work together to prevent such occurrences in the future," he emphasized.

The SHET Department's initiative aims to promote a culture of safety and responsibility among operators and drivers, ensuring that copper production is achieved without compromising the well-being of employees or damaging critical equipment.

And Lubambe Mine Manager, Mr Alfred Ng'ambi expressed concern over the frequency of equipment damage incidents, noting that despite having competent operators, the mine was experiencing a high number of occurrences that were resulting in vehicle damage.

Dump Truck Fire Incident

What happened?

While the Operator for Dump Truck with fleet number DT17 was tramming the machine from 205mL tips to the section, upon reaching Ramp 4 – 509mL Decline, he observed smoke coming from the alternator pulley. He promptly stopped the machine and used a portable 9Kg Dry Chemical Powder fire extinguisher to quench the smoke. No personal injuries were recorded.

Potential Consequences;

- It can result into fatal/death and serious injuries.
- This may cause loss of production.
- Legal fines

Direct causes

Equipment Failure - One of the engine belt tensioners got seized and it overheated.

Key Learnings

- HER Mechanics should enhance engine pulleys checks during planned maintenance.
- All Mobile equipment must carry fire extinguishers which should be in good working order.
- Fire suppression must be readily available in mobile equipment.

To prevent similar incidents occurring, always ensure that:

Belt tensioner components are thoroughly checked when carrying out major maintenance on machines.
